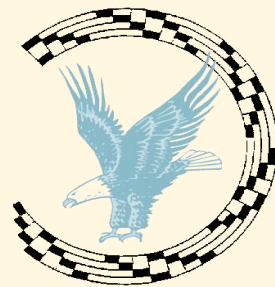

Principal's Letter

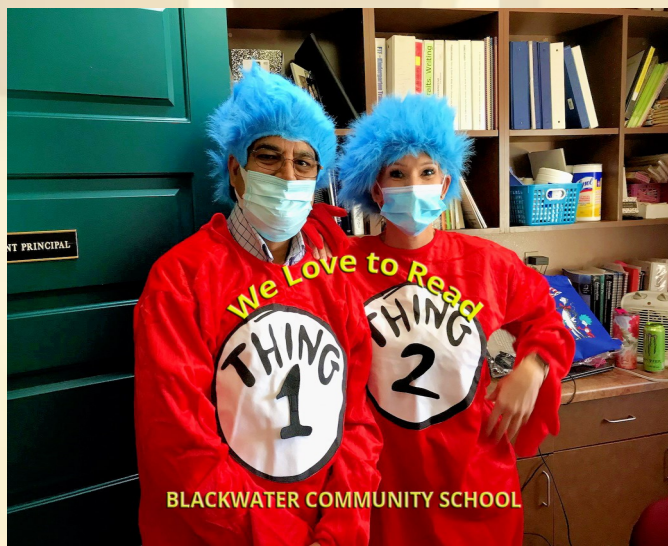
Dear Parents and Guardians

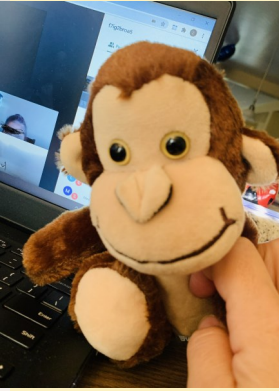

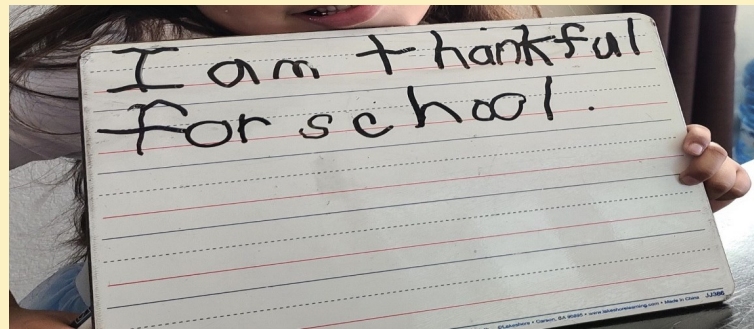


Mrs. Pru-John-Off-Ski & Ms. Cox Kinder-A.



Starting our first virtual education adventure in July 2020 was a challenge that our students, families and we have met. All students were provided laptops for our daily Google Meets. We have used song, coloring, white

board activities, and tactile materials to bring the joy of learning into the lives of our students. We enjoy sharing our "stuffies" during reading time. We celebrated Valentine's Day, 100th Day of School and so many milestones in the year together. We are learning our alphabet letter names, sounds, sight words, and counting all the way to 100! We are mastering our addition and subtraction facts, too. Thank you to all our families that support our educational endeavors, every day!

KB is doing great this year! We are powering through virtual learning during the '20-'21 school year so far. We all have had our ups and downs, technology wise, but we are all figuring this out together! We start up our day with reading, and within that we have been learning the letter names, letter sounds, and sight words. The kids have been using their letter sound to blend and segment words, and I have seen amazing growth with them! In the middle of our day we have math. The kids have been counting to 100, reading and writing their number to 10, and doing simple addition and subtraction. We just started our teen numbers. We are working on decomposing and finding the groups within the numbers 11-20. We end our day with writing. In this lesson the kids work on writing their names, writing sentences, and writing with our sight words. They even use what they know about letter names and sounds to help me spell the words we use in our writing. Also during our last lesson we try to read stories together to spark their love of reading. It has been a struggle for all of us to do this virtually, but I know that in KB we are pushing through and doing the best we can!

Note to parents: Keep practicing at home! Work on those letter names, letter sounds, and sight words! Practice writing your number and counting as high as you can go. Finally, practice writing your name, our sight words, or any words that you find around the house!

Our KC students have overcome the difficulties of this new wave of online learning. We are full steam ahead with acquiring the skills needed for a successful First Grade Transition. With this new wave of learning and differentiated teaching we use a collaboration of Google Classroom, Smarty Ants, YouTube, Raz-Kids, Journeys, and Think Central in addition to biweekly take home packets to support their academic needs.

Furthermore, students are also producing technological and visual work in highly creative ways with the use of Flip Grid video recordings. They've discussed things from oral and written narratives and responses to questions, to projects and reports. Many students have mastered the letter names, sounds, number identification 0-100, counting by 1's 5's and 10's as well as blending sounds, CVC words, and sight words. Those building blocks lead to word recognition, spelling, comprehension and sentence building.

In addition, Mr. McMullen and I are truly grateful for the parents/guardians who have stepped up and remain vigilant and consistent during these challenging technological times. They are phenomenal and are a vital part to this new educational partnership.



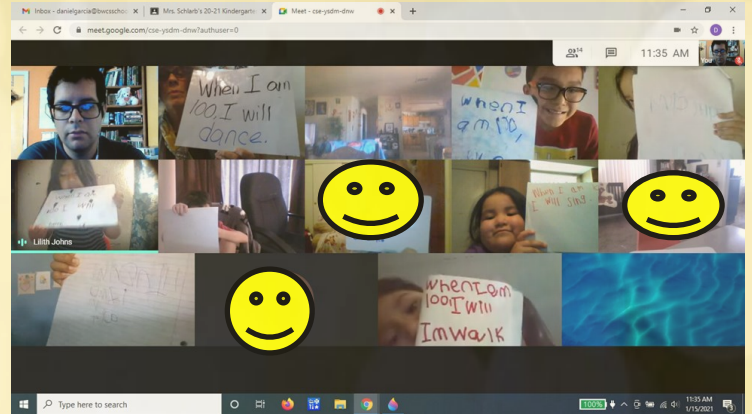

Some of those tools are logging in to Google Classroom, Smarty Ants, Raz-Kids and Think Central. Students are also producing demonstration of knowledge in creative ways through Flip Grid with video recordings.

Many students have mastered the letter names and sounds of the alphabet. Currently, many are working on blending CVC words and mastery of sight words (that must be memorized.)
