

# From the Principal's Desk

#### Dear Parents and Guardians

As you may know our school started officially on July 21st, 2021 offering In-Person as well as "Distance Learning" instructions, thereby making sure parents have the option to choose either option. After receiving the amended Executive Order #12 from Tribal Administration, we switched to full "Distance-Learning model" to keep our students, staff and community safe. School made special arrangements with the Tribal Education office for getting approval to continue providing "In-Person" instructions to some of our students with special needs.

I do get many phone calls from parents about how much their children miss the school and in-person instructions. I would like to remind our parents and guardians about making sure to provide the safe and quiet learning environment to your child during his/her virtual class times. That means, there should not be any background noise from television, music, and or from loud conversations. Secondly, if your child is in early grades such as preschool, kindergarten or first grade, please sit by your child and help them along the way while they are learning during virtual classes. Thirdly, as mentioned in my previous letter, attendance is very important and is directly related to the mastery of academic achievement of your child. Please ensure you child is in class every day, school is in session.

Our school has provided laptops and Ipads to each child enrolled at our school. Our teachers and paraprofessionals have been trained on Google Classroom as an instructional delivery platform. Please make sure to avoid any food or drinks close to the laptops and Ipads. Last year we received about 75 damaged devices primarily due to this type accidents. Please help us in teaching your child to respect the school property with utmost respect.

School administration and our admin offices have moved over to the new admin building at this time. If you are planning to visit to our school, please make sure you are driving to the new admin building. We have plenty of parking available under the covered area.

Dear Parents/Guardians

We are pleased to notify you that in accordance with Every *Student Succeeds Act*(ESSA), you have the right to request information regarding the professional qualifications of your child's teacher. Specifically, you may request the following:

- Whether the teacher has met State qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction.
- Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or substitute status.
- The baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree.
- Whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.
